

# Sutton Hoo

**Sutton Hoo is the site of two early medieval cemeteries dating from the 6th to 7th centuries near the English town of Woodbridge.**

**Archaeologists have been excavating the area since 1938, when a previously undisturbed ship burial containing a wealth of Anglo-Saxon artefacts was discovered.**

**The site is important in establishing the history of the Anglo-Saxon kingdom of East Anglia and illuminates the Anglo-Saxons during a period which lacks historical documentation.**
