

Sutton Hoo

Sutton Hoo is the site of two early medieval cemeteries dating from the 6th to 7th centuries near the English town of Woodbridge.

Archaeologists have been excavating the area since 1938, when a previously undisturbed ship burial containing a wealth of Anglo-Saxon artefacts was discovered.

The site is important in establishing the history of the Anglo-Saxon kingdom of East Anglia and illuminates the Anglo-Saxons during a period which lacks historical documentation.






